

We utilize progressive grading practices and multi-tiered systems of support that enable us to meet our students' needs exactly where they are as individuals. Weston High School staff addresses the whole child through numerous approaches including: trauma-informed practices, restorative practices, onsite mental health services, a built-in intervention/enrichment period, and monthly recognition for attendance and academics.
